
Martin Luther King Jr.: A Life of Courage and Leadership



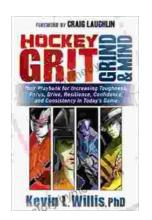

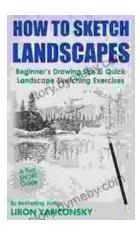
