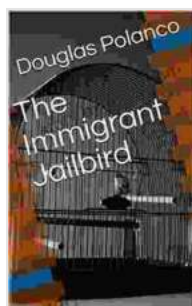

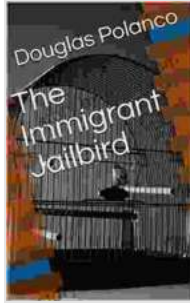
Mimi Schwartz died in 2019 at the age of 91. She is survived by her two children and four grandchildren.

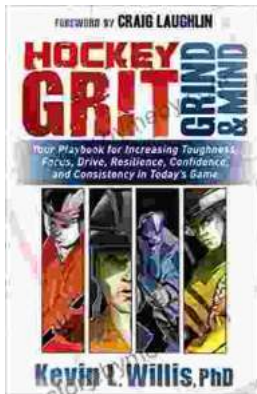

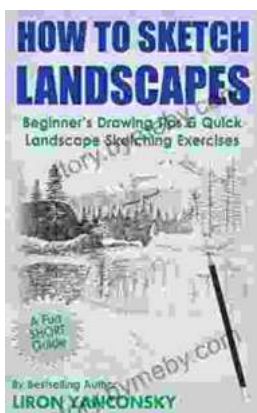
